## 2016-2017 Registration

Registration for returning students will continue this month. Early registration helps Meezan to plan our classrooms for the coming year and ensures that we have adequate resources for all our students. We will be extending a discounted registration fee of \$100 per student for two weeks, until May 14<sup>th</sup>. After this date, registration fee will be \$150.00 per student. This is a non-refundable fee and will hold your child's place for the next school year, 2016-2017. Spots are limited, so please register early. Once all available spots are filled, students will be placed on a waiting list.

Parents can drop by the office or make an appointment. Please note that a student's place will not be confirmed until the registration fee is paid. All registration fees are used to help purchase classroom supplies.

## Appropriate Dress: Indoor Shoes

As the weather continues to change, please make sure that your children are dressed appropriately for outdoor activities and recess. Being outside for fresh air is important for healthy, growing children. It also helps them focus better while in class. **Children should have waterproof footwear. For younger children extra socks and an extra pair of pants is a good idea.** All clothing items should be labelled with your child's name. **A separate pair of clean, comfortable running shoes are absolutely MANDATORY for indoor wear.** For safety and hygiene, children must have shoes on at ALL times during the school day!

Students are also expected to abide by the school dress code. It is meant to promote an inclusive and safe environment, where students are dressed appropriately and focused on learning.
